SUPPLY CHECK LIST



Students should come prepared the first day of school with the following supplies:

- _____ *The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Teens* Book by Sean Covey
*** Book will be used for both 7th and 8th grade years
- _____ An Agenda/Planner Book to record assignments, tests, projects, etc.
- _____ Individual 1 inch to 1 ½ inch 3-Ring Binders for each subject with tab dividers
*** Note: Two binders are needed for Science (class and Science Fair). One **2 inch** binder for 7th and 8th grade Math notes. One binder with clear plastic sleeves on front and back cover and a 1 subject spiral notebook for Theology. Regular binders for Social Studies, Language Arts, etc.
- _____ **TWO** Composition Books - Wide Ruled (for English Journal and Science Labs)
- _____ A 3-Holed Pocket Folder for each subject, 3 Folders (color; 3-pronged) for English book units, and a 3-pronged pocket folder for Science
*** Completed homework and miscellaneous papers should be stored and transported in these folders.
- _____ A supply of Loose Leaf Paper and Graph Paper
*** All assignments turned in are to be completed on good loose leaf paper. **NO SPIRAL NOTEBOOKS!**
- _____ A supply of **BLACK** and/or **DARK BLUE INK PENS**, and **RED** pen
*** Students should always have a working pen for academic subjects.
NOTE: Work done in other colors will not be accepted.
- _____ A supply of Pencils and Erasers
*** Students should always have a pencil for academic subjects -- especially math class
- _____ Highlighters and Dry Erase Pens
- _____ A 12 inch Ruler with metric measures
- _____ A Flash Drive (for saving research files from school to home and visa versa)
- _____ A plastic 3-Hole Punch (that will fit in a binder)
- _____ A Mini Stapler
- _____ A package of colored pencils and markers
- _____ A supply box/pouch/container for most of the above items
- _____ Headphones to be used for Computer Class

TIPS FOR PARENTS:

→ Though your daughter has an agenda book, and access to NetClassroom for teacher-posted assignments, it is very helpful to have a **LARGE DESK CALENDAR** where together you note important dates for tests and projects.

→ To avoid those last minute "needs" your daughter may have for an assignment, we suggest that you, over time, create a mini supply store at home. Having a few art supplies, poster board, construction paper, **a good ruler or yard stick, extra computer paper, a spare printer cartridge, and some extra school supplies** stashed away can be a lifesaver to both you and your daughter!
